



Golf Package: Inverness area

Three-night package with four rounds of golf

How to get to Inverness:

Inverness Airport: Scheduled flights operate between Inverness and London Gatwick, London Luton, Amsterdam, Belfast City, Birmingham, Bristol, and Manchester. There are seasonal routes to Dusseldorf and Zurich.

Inverness by train: Inverness can be reached by rail from all the major Scottish cities. An overnight sleeper service connects the city with London.

Aberdeen Airport: Aberdeen Airport has scheduled flights to all the major UK airports, and also Amsterdam, Copenhagen, Dublin, Esbjerg, Frankfurt, Paris and Stavanger.

Day 1	On day one you can experience the links of Castle Stuart Opened in 2009, Castle Stuart is a highly-acclaimed links course set on the Moray Firth and affords striking views of the local landscape. Designed by Gil Hanse, the par 72 course runs to 7,009 yards and provides a good test to golfers of all abilities. Twelve holes are tucked inland and routed over higher ground, while the remaining six are beauties that literally skirt along the Moray Firth, a couple of which are unforgettable. The course hosted the Scottish Open in 2011 and will again be the venue in 2012.
Night 1	In the evening you can enjoy a cruise along the Moray Firth and enjoy some of Scotland's stunning scenery and maybe catch a glimpse of the dolphins that frequent the area. Overnight the vessel will be berthed in Inverness and this will allow you to go ashore and explore the capital of Highland Scotland.
Day 2	Your second day brings the challenge of Royal Dornoch Golf was played on the links at Dornoch long before Royal Dornoch Golf Club was formed in 1877. Today, its spellbinding course has become a must-play for golfers from across the world. The 18-hole, par 70, 6,595-yard championship course is a pleasing place to enjoy golf. Isolated and wild, but absolutely beautiful, each hole requires precision and strategy, especially as many of the greens are built on natural raised plateau which makes approach play especially challenging. Royal Dornoch is a favourite of former Open winner Tom Watson. After taking on Royal Dornoch you will be treated to cruise on Loch Ness , giving you a chance to experience some dramatic scenery and spot some majestic wildlife.



Night 2	After cruising the length on Loch Ness , the vessel will berth overnight in the village of Fort Augustus . The village has a number of local amenities.
Day 3	<p>On day three the inland Spey Valley course is played Opened in 2006 and designed by Dave Thomas, Spey Valley golf course is situated close to the town of Aviemore and has the Cairngorm Mountains as a spectacular backdrop. The par 72, 18-hole layout measures nearly 7,200 yards and features one of the longest par 5 holes in Scotland, which from the back tees is a full 641 yards in length. It is a fine inland course and certainly one of the most picturesque.</p> <p>Following your round at Spey Valley, you will rejoin Scotia W and cruise back to Inverness.</p>
Night 3	The vessel will again berth overnight in Inverness .
Day 4	<p>Your final day involves playing Nairn Golf Club Stretched out along the shores of the Moray Firth, Nairn Golf Club is one of the finest links courses in Scotland and is capable of testing the most gifted players. Played from the championship tees the courses is a par 72 and measures 6,774 yards. The course boasts fast, hard to read greens, thick links gorse and tee shots on the first seven holes that could end up in the Moray Firth – all of which combine to provide one of the toughest and most enjoyable challenges you're ever likely to face. Nairn has hosted a number of high-profile championships including the Walker Cup in 1999 and in 2012 it will host the Curtis Cup.</p>

Total package cost, excluding transfers: £1,065 per person

Package includes: Four rounds of golf on the above named courses and three nights dinner, bed and breakfast aboard Scotia W. This package is ideal for a group of eight golfers.

Transfers to and from the boat can be organised by Scotia Charters and would be charged at cost. Approximate total transfer distance (based on Inverness Airport being arrival and departure point) – 255 miles (410km)
